Dear Friends and Supporters,

As we reflect on 2024, I am filled with immense gratitude and pride for all that we have accomplished together. This year has been one of incredible milestones, transformational growth, and life-changing impact, which would not have been possible without your unwavering support and generosity.

One of our most significant achievements was the completion of a brand-new, 4,000-square-foot **Maternity Ward**, built from the ground up to accommodate the increasing need for prenatal care, safe infant deliveries, and overall women's healthcare services. This state-of-the-art facility will provide critical medical care to expectant mothers and newborns, ensuring healthier futures for generations to come.

We also celebrated the graduation of **500 young adults** from **New Hope Vocational Institute (NHVI)**. These graduates earned certificates in skilled trades such as hairdressing, tailoring, bricklaying, carpentry, and more, equipping them with the tools they need to build sustainable livelihoods. Their hard work and dedication serve as an inspiration to all.

In response to an unforeseen tragedy, we successfully constructed a brand-new **boys' dormitory**, providing safe and stable housing for approximately 50–60 boys who lost their previous home due to a devastating fire. The resilience of these young men, coupled with the outpouring of support from our community, has been truly remarkable.

This year also saw a landmark **three-day workshop** for **150 NHVI students**, facilitated by the BHTFUSA team. These sessions covered critical life skills such as **entrepreneurship, goal setting, budgeting, self-esteem building, and teamwork**, with mentorship provided by program graduates. The enthusiasm and engagement of the students were a testament to the importance of these lessons in shaping their futures.

Through the **Home Again Children's Home**, we continued to provide essential tuition, medical care, and overall support for children from infancy to university levels. Thanks to the generosity of a **new donor**, we were able to secure funding for **25 university students**, covering their education for **three to four years**—a life-changing opportunity that will open doors to promising careers and brighter futures.

Additionally, as part of our **community development efforts**, we successfully **constructed two new water wells** and **two large water tanks**, providing clean and accessible water to hundreds of families. These projects are fundamental in improving public health, reducing waterborne diseases, and enhancing the overall well-being of our communities.

None of these achievements would have been possible without our incredible network of supporters, donors, volunteers, and dedicated team members. Each of you has played a role in transforming lives and strengthening communities, and for that, we extend our deepest gratitude.

As we look ahead to 2025, we remain committed to expanding our impact, reaching even more children and families in need, and fostering sustainable solutions for education, healthcare, and community development. Together, we are building a future filled with hope, opportunity, and resilience.

Thank you for believing in our mission and for being an integral part of this journey. We look forward to another year of meaningful change and continued success.

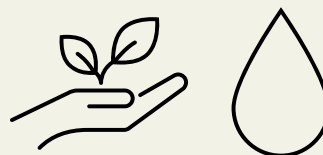
## Clean Water, Brighter Futures

**Annual mentorship programs** build self-esteem & accountability.

Students gain real-world experience through **business & farm visits.**

**Innovation encouraged** to inspire creativity & progress.

- New maternity ward built, awaiting equipment & furnishings.
- Medical team expanded: 2 doctors, 6 nurses, 2 midwives, 2 technicians.
- Donor-supported professionals now employed at Hope Again Medical Centre.
- Vaccination programs ensure preventative care.
- Essential treatments provided for malaria, TB, & COVID-19.
- Comprehensive maternal care: maternity services, family planning, prenatal classes.
- Lifesaving HIV/AIDS treatment & education led by Peace Corps volunteers.
- New ambulance launched, expanding emergency care.

BHTFUSA successfully secured full funding for HACH, covering:

- **Children's Education:**

- 68 infants and toddlers in the Baby House
- 158 children enrolled in Kindergarten
- 149 students in Primary 1-3
- 131 Secondary Students
- 104 students in tertiary education & university

- **Essential Needs:**

- Food and cooking supplies
- Soap and diapers
- Clothing and bedding
- Medical support

- **Staff & Infrastructure:**

- Support for 163 staff members
- Construction of kitchens and latrines
- Construction of a new dorm for P2 students

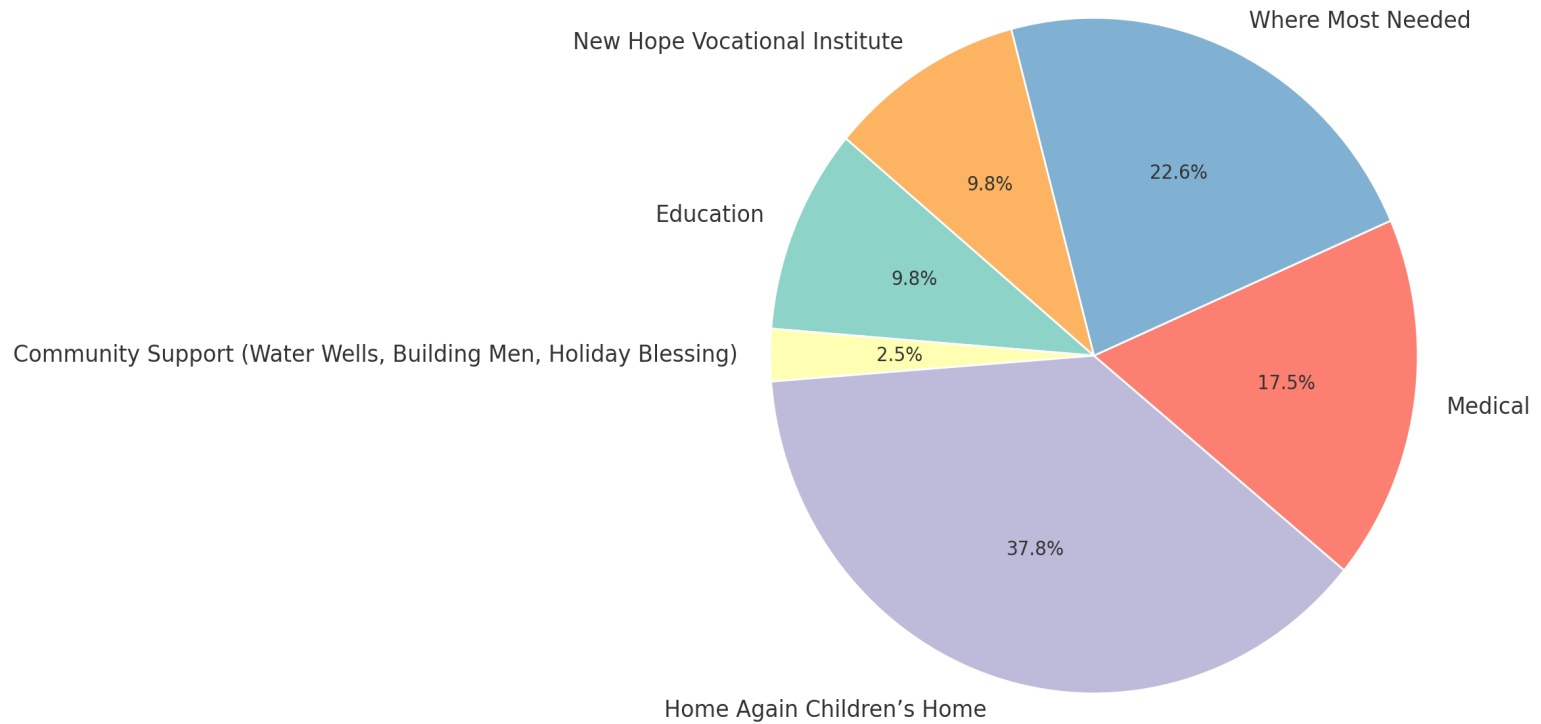
